### Fall Back!

Daylight Saving Time 2025 ended today, Sunday, November 2nd at 2:00 a.m.

Hopefully, before you went to bed on Saturday night, you remembered to “fall back” by setting your clocks back one hour. The exceptions are Arizona, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and American Samoa.

Credit for Daylight Saving Time belongs to Benjamin Franklin, who first suggested the idea in 1784. The idea was revived in 1907, when William Willett, an Englishman, proposed a similar system in the pamphlet *The Waste of Daylight*. The Germans were the first to officially adopt the light-extending system in 1915 as a fuel-saving measure during World War I. The British switched one year later, and the United States followed in 1918, when Congress passed the Standard Time Act, which established our time zones. This experiment lasted only until 1920, when the law was repealed due to opposition from dairy farmers (**cows** don't pay attention to clocks).

During World War II, Daylight Saving Time was imposed once again (this time year-round) to save fuel. Since then, Daylight Saving Time has been used on and off, with different start and end dates. Currently, Daylight Saving Time begins at 2:00 a.m. on the second Sunday of March and ends at 2:00 a.m. on

the first Sunday in November.

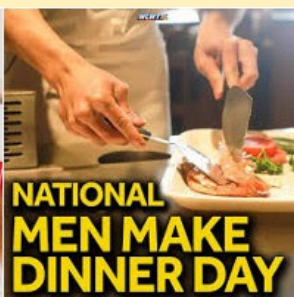

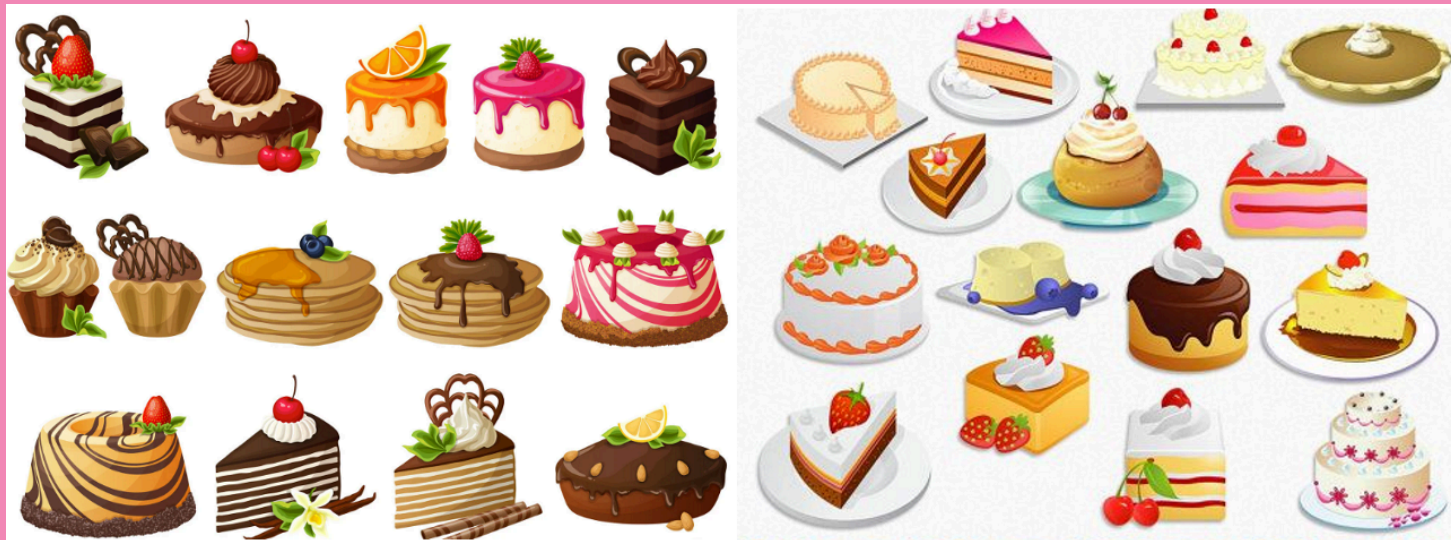
### **Baking Competition**

## Burn Ban In Effect

The Guadalupe County Commissions Court instituted an outdoor burn ban for Guadalupe County for 90 days starting September 3rd and going through December 1st. The burn ban imposed by the Commissioners Court has **specific** guidelines for

-  Welding, cutting, and grinding or any activity that causes a spark
-  Burning household trash
-  Burning of other items

The City of Kingsbury has a "trigger" ordinance where a burn ban is in effect in the city limits whenever there is a burn ban issued by the county.



As always, please take precautions and report any fire hazards immediately to the Kingsbury Volunteer Fire Department at 639-4499 or to the Guadalupe Fire Dispatch at 379-1224. To report a fire, please dial 911.



Of the 254 counties in Texas, there are currently 136 that have a burn ban. This is way down from 163 last week and leaves 118 counties without a burn ban in the state.

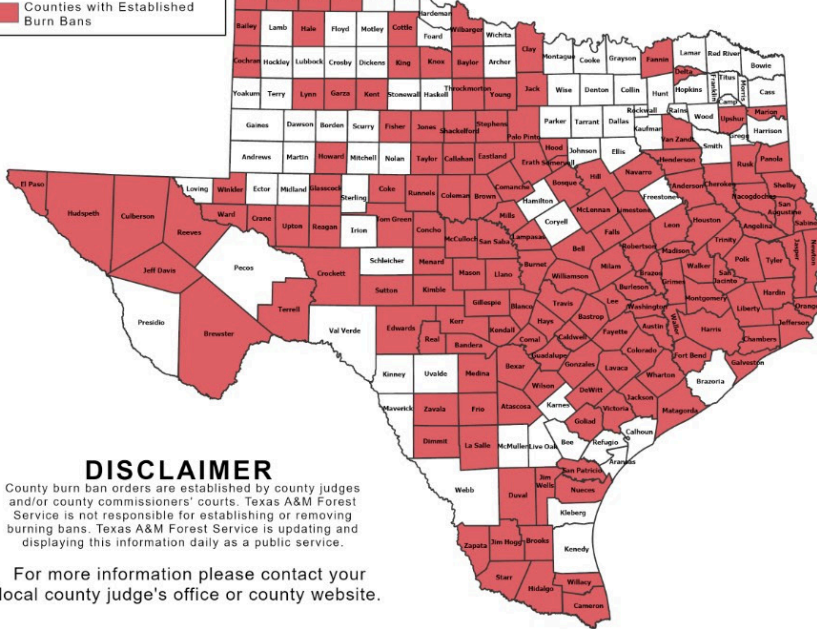

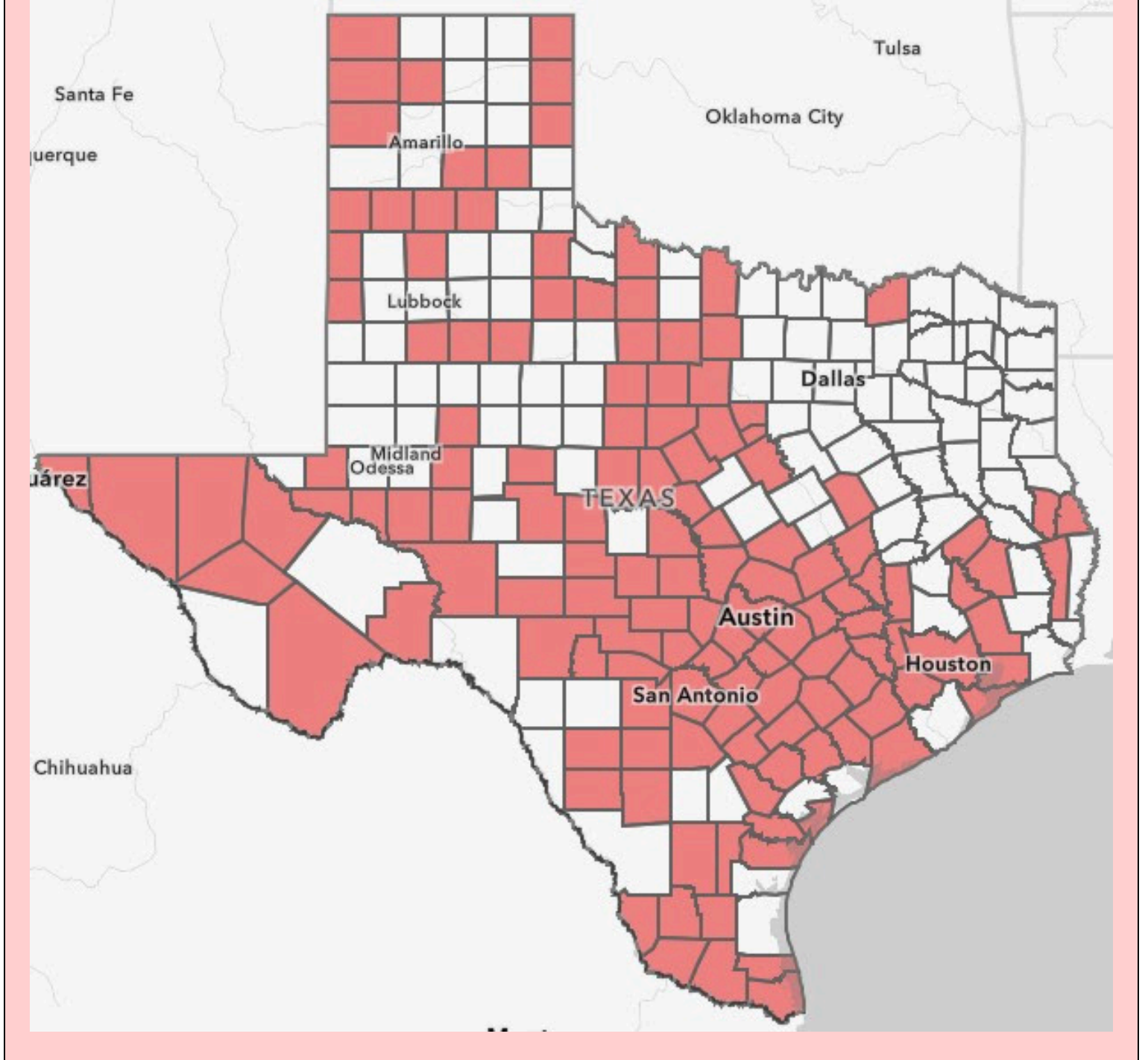

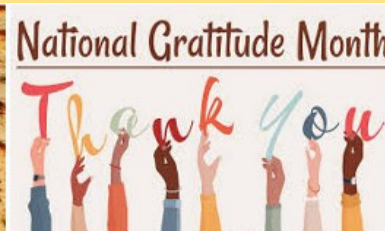

**Full Beaver Supermoon**

This week will be the full moon known as the Full Beaver Moon. This is our second of three Supermoons of the year and it will appear bigger and brighter than normal! The full Moon reaches peak illumination on Wednesday, November 5th at 7:19 am Kingsbury time. Of course, it will be very close to full the night before, so plan to look for it starting on Tuesday, November 4th, just after sunset!

November's full Moon was called the Beaver Moon by both the colonists and the Algonquin tribes because this was the time to set beaver traps before the **swamps** froze, to ensure a supply of warm winter furs. It's also when beavers become particularly active - building their winter dams in preparation for the cold season.

The November full Moon has also been called the Frost Moon and the Freezing Moon. Judging by the chilly weather that becomes more and more common at this time of year, it's not hard to understand how these names came about. Another name, the Digging (or Scratching) Moon, evokes an image of animals scratching at the fallen leaves, foraging for fallen nuts or remaining shoots of green foliage—with the implication that winter is on its way.

*Mohawk - Time Of Much Poverty Moon*

*Choctaw - Moon of the Panther*

*Winnebago - Little Bear's Moon*

*Comanche - Heading to Winter Moon*

*Hopi - Moon of Fledgling Hawk*

*Pueblo - Moon When All Is Gathered In*

*Kalapuya (Pacific NW) - Moving Inside For Winter Moon*

*Abenaki - Freezing River Maker Moon*

*Shawnee - Long Moon*

*Tlingit (Pacific NW coast) - Scraping Moon*

*Lakota - Moon When Winter Begins*

*Wishram - Snowy Mountains In The Morning Moon*

*Potawatomi (Great Lakes) - Moon Of The Turkey*

*Sioux - Falling Leaves Moon*


*Cherokee - Trading Moon*


*Shoshone - Cold Moon*

*Choctaw - Sassafras Moon*

*Dakotah Sioux - Moon When Horns Are Broken Off*

## MOON FACTS

 Did you know: The spin-time of the Moon on its own axis is identical to the time it takes the Moon to revolve around Earth, which is why the Moon always keeps almost exactly the same face toward us.

 How much would you weigh on the Moon? Just multiply your weight (it doesn't matter if it's in pounds or kilograms) by 0.165. You'd weigh about 80 percent less!

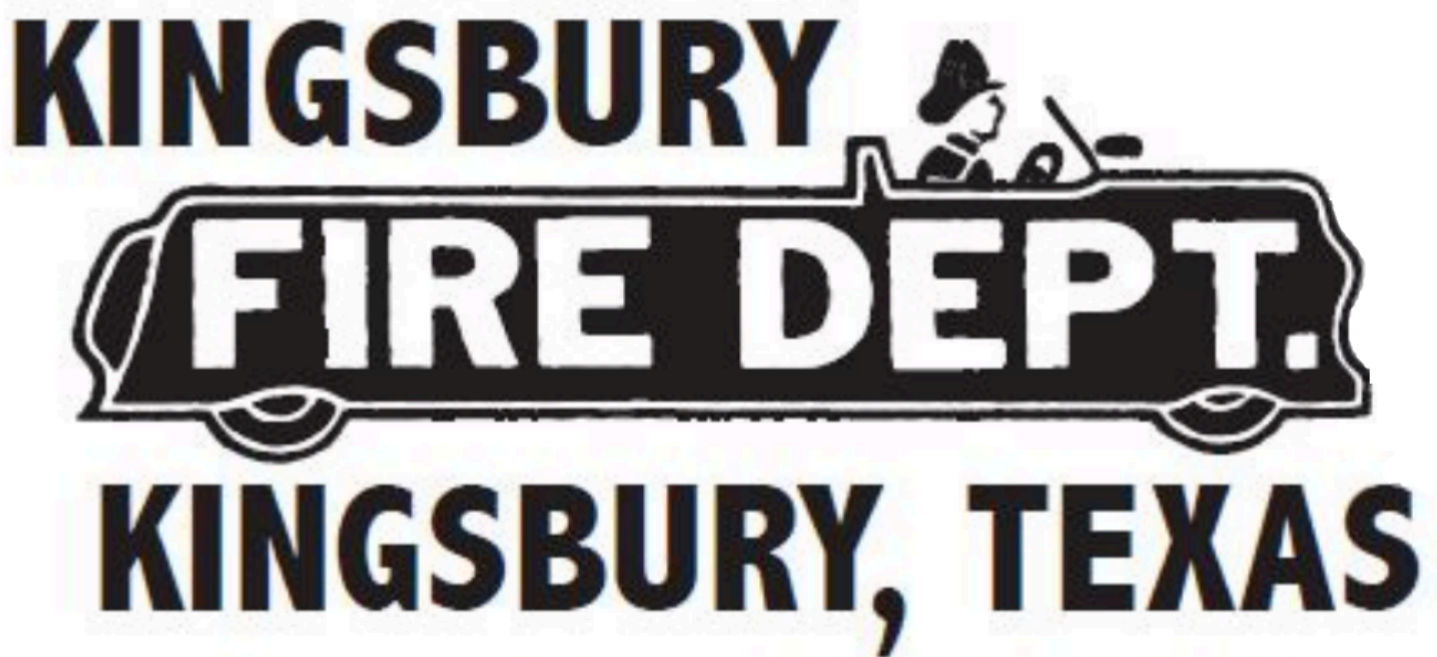

Election Day is this Tuesday, November 4th and here is some important information regarding the election:

### Ballot Items:

Depending on your address, items on your ballot may be different. But most people in the Kingsbury area will have the following on their **ballot**:

- Texas Proposition 1, Establish Special Funds for State Technical College System Amendment
- Texas Proposition 2, Prohibit Capital Gains Tax on Individuals, Estates, and Trusts Amendment
- Texas Proposition 3, Denial of Bail for Certain Violent or Sexual Offenses Punishable as a Felony Amendment
- Texas Proposition 4, Allocate Portion of Sales Tax Revenue to Water Fund Amendment
- Texas Proposition 5, Property Tax Exemption on Retail Animal Feed Amendment
- Texas Proposition 6, Prohibit Taxes on Certain Securities Transactions Amendment
- Texas Proposition 7, Establish Homestead Exemption for Surviving Spouses of Veterans Killed by a Service-Connected Disease Amendment
- Texas Proposition 8, Prohibit Estate Taxes and New Taxes on Estate Transfers, Inheritances, and Gifts Amendment
- Texas Proposition 9, Authorize \$125,000 Tax Exemption for Tangible Property Used for Income Production Amendment
- Texas Proposition 10, Property Tax Exemption for Improvements to Homestead Destroyed by Fire Amendment
- Texas Proposition 11, Increase Homestead Tax Exemption for Elderly and Disabled Amendment
- Texas Proposition 12, Change Membership and Authority of State Commission on Judicial Conduct Amendment
- Texas Proposition 13, Increase Homestead Property Tax Exemption Amendment
- Texas Proposition 14, Establish Dementia Prevention and Research Institute of Texas Amendment
- Texas Proposition 15, Parental Rights Amendment
- Texas Proposition 16, Citizenship Voting Requirement Amendment
- Texas Proposition 17, Property Tax Exemption for Border Security Infrastructure Amendment

**Kingsbury City Limits**

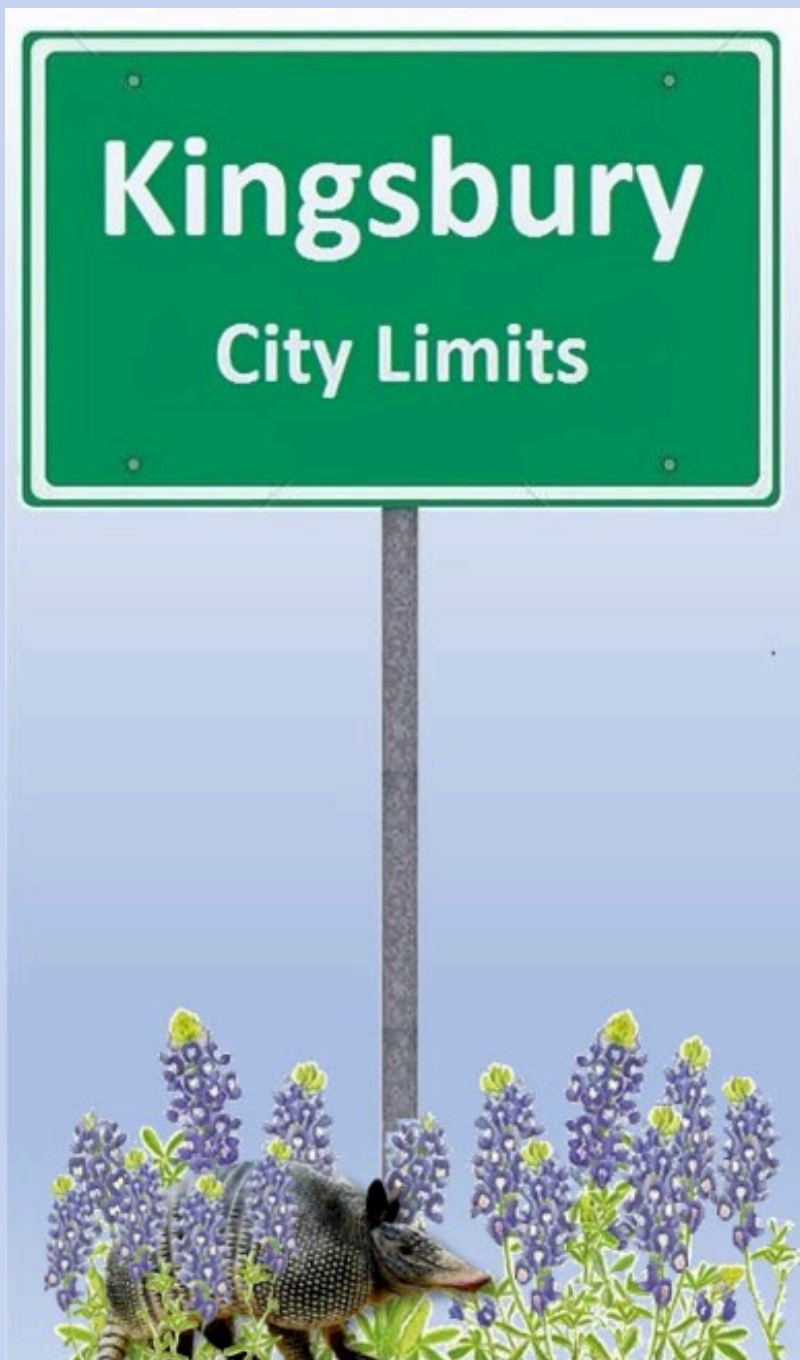

The Kingsbury Lutheran Church will be having weekly Fellowship gatherings every Thursday.

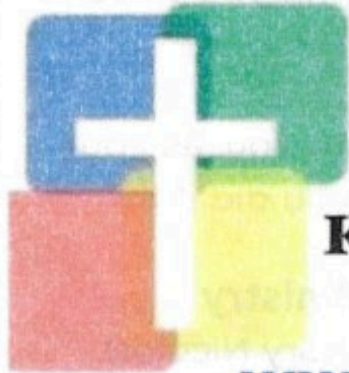
These get-togethers start at 6:30 in the Fellowship Hall and the **activities** could be a mix of food, Bible study, games, etc.
