
The polling place in Kingsbury on Election Day, November 2nd, will be The Kingsbury Methodist Church (7035 FM 2438).



Kingsbury Fall Harvest Festival

The 10th Annual Fall Harvest Festival is scheduled for Saturday, November 13th in downtown Kingsbury!

The activities go from Noon till 6 and include

As part of the Festival this year, there is an Open Call for art pieces:

Fall Harvest Festival Open Call:

We invite you to create an art piece that will be exhibited as part of a competition at this year's Fall Harvest Festival. The artwork will be judged by a panel curated by Habitable Spaces administration with prize ribbons in each category. The grand prize winner will receive a blue ribbon and \$100 in cash. After the competition, the pieces will be auctioned off during the festival and the proceeds will go to support the Kingsbury Volunteer Fire Department and the Fall Harvest Festival.

Registration deadline is October 23rd.

Pieces must be delivered by Saturday October 30 and will be on view all week until the Fall Harvest festival.

Prize ribbons will be awarded on November 5th.

ALL ARTWORK MUST FIT INTO ONE OF THESE CATEGORIES:

1. ONE MAN'S TRASH IS ANOTHER MAN'S TREASURE Take something that has been discarded and make it into something with value.

2. ART ON THE RANGE

Create something that can be displayed as a public art piece in an outdoor space in the country. All pieces must fit into the following categories.

The materials in the piece must be agriculturally based

OR

When the piece decays, it must give back to the place that it inhabits.


Examples of possible pieces could include:

A quilt made from used feed bags, a sculpture made with hay bales, a giant cowboy made out of old farm equipment.

All artwork that needs a tractor or large equipment for installation must be installed and de-installed by the artist or artist team.

At the S. A. Queen


The S.A. Queen in Kingsbury was in what is now the vacant lot next to the old post office on Railway Street. It was owned by Sterling Anderson "S.A." Queen and his wife Annie Pearl Walker Queen, and locals referred to it simply as "Queen's" or "Queen's Cafe". The Queens (S.A., Annie, and daughter Uyvonne) lived in the building, sold burgers in the cafe, and had a bar with bar stools and a juke box.

The girls here are Mary Jane Appling, Glenda Ferrell, Joyce Hurt, and Dorothy Chessher. They may be going to the theater which was west of Queens and apparently was showing the movie "Algiers" with Charles Boyer and Hedy Lamarr.

That movie was about a thief hiding in the native quarter of Algiers called the Casbah, and was the inspiration for the movie Casablanca. Boyer's character, Pepe le Moko, is said to be the inspiration for Looney Toons' skunk Pepe le Pew who was known for telling a reluctant cat (that always had a mishap with some white paint) "Come wis me to ze Casbah!"

It's a long way from Kingsbury to "ze Casbah", but that's what movies are for!
