There will be breakfast food and hot coffee available to the trail riders and everyone that wants to stop by and say "Howdy!" while they're here!




Kingsbury City Limits


Here Comes February

January and February were the last two months to be added to the Roman calendar, since the Romans originally considered winter a monthless period.



Kingsbury weather for this week. You can always get the latest **weather** in Kingsbury on the Kingsbury website under Calendar.



Groundhog Day

This week on Friday, February 2nd, it's Groundhog Day!

According to tradition, if a groundhog comes out of its hole on this day and sees its shadow, there will be six more weeks of winter weather; no shadow means an early spring.

On February 2, 1887, Groundhog Day, featuring a rodent meteorologist, is celebrated for the first time at Gobbler's Knob in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania. Clymer H. Freas was the editor of the local paper Punxsutawney Spirit at the time, and he began promoting the town's groundhog as the official "Groundhog Day meteorologist".

Groundhog Day has its roots in the ancient Christian tradition of Candlemas Day, when clergy would bless and distribute candles needed for winter. The candles represented how long and cold the winter would be. Germans expanded on this concept by selecting an animal—the hedgehog—as a means of predicting weather. Once they came to America, German settlers in Pennsylvania continued the tradition, although they switched from hedgehogs to groundhogs, which were plentiful in the Keystone State.

Just what the heck is a groundhog anyway? According to Wikipedia: "The groundhog (*Marmota monax*), also known as a woodchuck, or **whistlepig**, is a rodent of the family *Sciuridae*, belonging to the group of large ground squirrels known as marmots. The groundhog is also referred to as a chuck, wood-shock, groundpig, whistler, thickwood badger, Canada marmot, monax, moonack, weenusk, and red monk. The name "thickwood badger" was given in the Northwest to distinguish the animal from the prairie badger. Monax was an Indian name of the woodchuck, which meant "the digger". Young groundhogs may be called chucklings. Other marmots, such as the yellow-bellied and hoary marmots, live in rocky and mountainous areas, but the groundhog is a lowland creature. It is widely distributed in North America and common in the northeastern and central United States and Canada. Groundhogs are found as far north as Alaska, with their habitat extending southeast to Georgia."

There you have it! Do you want 6 more weeks of winter? It's been a pretty light winter except for that hard, hard freeze a couple of weeks ago. We certainly don't want six more weeks of that!! I'm sure that some of the people up north that are dealing with polar vortexes are looking forward to the groundhog popping up with no shadow in sight.



As we do every year, we'll see if Kingsbury Kliff the Weather-Predicting Armadillo can give us some spring-like weather with a few more cold nights thrown in just to keep the bugs from taking over this summer! Check the Kingsbury website anytime for the local weather forecast - it's probably more reliable than a large rodent or a ... what *is* an armadillo anyway?

The Murder Steer

This week in Texas history, on January 28, 1891, Fine Gilliland shot and killed Fort Davis cattleman Henry Harrison Powe during a roundup near Leoncita Springs in Brewster County in Big Bend country.


Gilliland had been sent by the firm of Dubois and Wentworth to make sure none of the local ranchers appropriated any of the company's cattle; he became embroiled in a dispute with Powe over an unbranded brindle yearling steer found without its mother. Powe believed that the steer belonged to a cow with his HHP brand, but Gilliland disagreed - he dismounted and dropped to one knee, drew his weapon and fired. Several gunshots were exchanged between the two at close range and when the **gunsmoke** cleared, Henry Powe lay dead on the ground.

Gilliland fled on horseback, but was himself killed a few days later in a shootout with two Texas Rangers - shot

right between the eyes. The canyon where it happened is named Gilliland Canyon.

Meanwhile, the cowboys branded "MURDER" on one side of the yearling and "JAN 28 91" on the other. The outcast steer roamed the plains for years and was said to bring bad luck to anyone who crossed its path. The whole incident became so well known, it inspired an episode of the television series "Rawhide" and a ballad by Canadian folk singer lan Tyson.

As time went by, the legend of the Murder Steer grew. It was said it grew huge and mean, its eyes a bright red as it searched the range looking for the cowboys who marked him with that ominous brand. Legend has it that the "murder steer" still appears whenever foul play has occurred.




Kingsbury VFD


Thursday, February 1st

Model T Raffle


The Pioneer Flight Museum here in Kingsbury is raffling off a real model T!
