




Kingsbury City Limits














Texan Makes Aviation History

This week in aviation history, Texas native Wiley Post and Harold Gatty took off in an attempt to fly around the world. Post, born at Corinth in Van Zandt County, was one of the best-known fliers in the world.

On June 23, 1931, Post and the Australian navigator Harold Gatty, left Roosevelt Field on Long Island, New York, in the *Winnie Mae* with a flight plan that would take them around the world, stopping at Harbour Grace (Newfoundland and Labrador), Flintshire in Wales, Hanover twice, Berlin, Moscow, Novosibirsk in Siberia, Irkutsk (eastern Siberia), Blagoveshchensk (Russia), Khabarovsk (southeastern Russia), Nome (Alaska), where his propeller had to be repaired, Fairbanks, Alaska where the propeller was replaced, Edmonton in Alberta, Canada, and Cleveland before returning to Roosevelt Field.

They arrived back on July 1, after traveling 15,474 miles (24,903 km) in the record time of 8 days and 15 hours and 51 minutes, in the first successful aerial **circumnavigation** by a single-engined monoplane. The reception they received rivaled Charles Lindbergh's everywhere they went. They had lunch at the White House on July 6, rode in a ticker-tape parade the next day in New York City, and were honored at a banquet given by the Aeronautical Chamber of Commerce of America at the Hotel Astor. After the flight, Post acquired the *Winnie Mae* from F.C. Hall, and he and Gatty published an account of their journey titled, *Around the World in Eight Days*, with an introduction by Will Rogers.

Two years later, Post beat his earlier time by more than twenty-one hours. He may be most famous, however, for piloting the plane in which he and humorist Will Rogers died at Point Barrow, Alaska, on August 15, 1935.


That says it all, doesn't it?!

Gander Slough

A picture of Gander Slu, Texas, near Kingsbury and Sullivan in eastern Guadalupe County in 1923. Gander Slu was from 1859 to 1866 the site of a post office called Barrowsdale, after Dr. Leonard Barrow. Oil was discovered in the area in 1922 and Sullivan became a loading site for oil tank railroad cars. The landowner, a Mr. Allen, suggested the name Allensville for the community that grew up around the oilfield, but one of the workers suggested "Gander Slough," a play on the name of the Goose Creek oilfield near Baytown. The worker put up a sign with the spelling "Slu."

The population was twenty-five in 1945, when the settlement included a few houses, a cemetery, and oil pumps.

Gander Slu was not shown on county highway maps in 1987.

In the picture, one of the buildings on the left appears to be a big tent instead of a hard-sided structure. The road in front of it and the OK Cafe is an ugly, **sloppy** mess! And there are about as many gasoline-powered vehicles trying to traverse the mud as there are horse and mule carts.

I think the horses and mules probably won the war with the mud that day!
