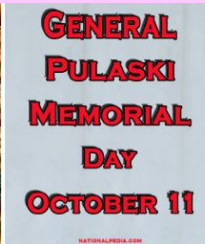

Rate Changes

The rates for use of the Kingsbury collection station are changing effective **November 1**, 2020.

Some charges have gone up slightly but the biggest change is that there will now be a \$2 per vehicle charge for recycling.
