

Burning of other items



Of the 254 counties in Texas, there are currently 212 that have a burn ban, up from 195 a week ago. With the lack of rain, that number will certainly continue to grow.

You'll be able to pick up farm fresh eggs and produce. Handcrafted items, homemade pies, cakes, and other baked goods are usually also available.








Kingsbury City Commission

Wildfire Danger

The hot and dry conditions continue to be the perfect situation for a small ember or spark to become a large **wildfire** in a matter of minutes. We have had our share of fires in the Kingsbury area and we must all be mindful about our situations and actions while we wait for some much needed rain.

The Texas A&M Forest Service latest update on wildfires across the state:

Current Situation July 16, 2022 at 10:00 a.m.

Yesterday, Texas A&M Forest Service firefighters responded to 15 new wildfires that burned 651 acres.

Continued triple digit temperatures and dry conditions will reduce the moisture in vegetation across the landscape, increasing the possibility of wildfire ignitions to occur this week.

There are currently 212 counties with burn bans.

Los Establos Fire, Kaufman County - 95 acres, 60% contained
Fence Line Fire, Milam County - 50 acres, 5% contained

South Bend Fire, Young County - est. 710 acres, 75% contained
Nethery Road Fire, Kimble County - est. 3,500 acres, 70% contained
Hard Castle Fire, Bosque County - est. 540 acres, 90% contained


The Kingsbury Owls Basketball Team
