We are gearing up for the KVFD Bar-B-Q Fundraiser on July 30th!


This is the annual benefit Bar-B-Q which is the primary fundraiser for the Fire Department, and held each year on the last Saturday in July.




Kingsbury City Limits

The Guadalupe County Commissions Court has instituted an outdoor burn **ban** for Guadalupe County. The burn ban imposed by the Commissioners Court has specific guidelines for

Welding, cutting, and grinding or any activity that causes a spark



Burning household trash

Burning of other items

The official notification with all the guidelines can be found on the Guadalupe County website here.



The City of Kingsbury has a "trigger" ordinance where a burn ban is in effect in the city limits whenever there is a burn ban issued by the county.






Of the 254 counties in Texas, there are currently 87 that have a burn ban (counting Guadalupe County which is not showing up on the state map yet), up from 68 last week.


The Beginning and the End For Sam Bass

This week in the Old West, on July 21 in 1851, notorious outlaw Sam Bass was born in Indiana; his short and violent life also ended on July 21, in 1878.

Born on a farm near Mitchell, Indiana, he was orphaned before he was thirteen and spent five years at the home of an uncle. In 1870, he arrived in Denton, Texas, handled horses in the stables and became interested in horse racing. Acquiring a fleet mount, he won most of his races. He then partnered with Joel Collins and gathered a small herd of longhorn cattle, drove them north and sold them in Deadwood, South Dakota. There Bass and Collins tried working in freighting and without success, then recruited several hard characters to rob stagecoaches. In search of bigger loot, with a band of six, led by Collins and Bass, they rode south to Big Springs, Nebraska. On September 18, 1877 they held up an eastbound Union Pacific passenger train taking \$60,000 in twenty-dollar gold pieces plus \$1,300 in cash. After dividing the loot the bandits decided to split up but a few weeks later Collins and two others were killed while resisting arrest.

Bass managed to make it back to Texas, where he formed a new outlaw band. In the spring of 1878, he with his brigands held up two stagecoaches and robbed four trains within twenty-five miles of Dallas. He and the bandits were the object of a chase across North Texas by posses and a special company of Texas Rangers headed by Junius Peak. Bass eluded his pursuers until his band rode into Round Rock, Texas, intending to rob a small bank. There on July 19, 1878, Bass and his men became engaged in a gun battle with Texas Rangers led by Major John B. Jones. Wounded in the gun fight, Bass was found lying helpless in a pasture north of town. Two searchers spotted a man propped up against a tree but assumed that he was only one of the railroad workers who were constructing the line of the Georgetown Railroad at the time. They eventually went up to him and Sam held up his hand and uttered, "I am Sam Bass, the man that has been wanted so long." He was taken back to Round Rock and died two days later on his 27th birthday.

He is still buried in the Round Rock Cemetery on the west side near the fence.


Woodrow Center School Kids

The school bus to the Woodrow Center School, maybe around 1929.

A number of people in the Kingsbury area went to the Woodrow Center School when it operated, and by the smiles on the faces in this picture, all the kids **loved** it! The Woodrow Center School was in the area of Sullivan, down the road from Kingsbury towards Luling. If you go under the railroad trestle at, appropriately enough,

Trestle Road, it immediately hits Woodrow Center Road. Woodrow Center Road intersects with Gander Slough Road at both ends (Gander Slough Road is roughly a big, upside down "V").

When the Gander Slu oil fields were striking it big (starting in about 1922), a lot of the children in that area attended the Woodrow Center School.
