Downtown Kingsbury From noon to 3 Every Sunday



Iditarod 2021

The Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race starts today in Deshka Landing, Alaska.

The Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race is an annual long-distance sled dog race run in early March from (usually) Anchorage to Nome, entirely within the US state of Alaska. Mushers and a team of 16 dogs, of which at least 5 must be on the towline at the finish line, cover the distance in 8–15 days or more. The Iditarod began in 1973 as an event to test the best sled dog **mushers** and teams but evolved into today's highly competitive race. Then a record, the second fastest winning time was recorded in 2016 by Dallas Seavey with a time of 8 days, 11 hours, 20 minutes, and 16 seconds. As of 2012, Dallas Seavey was also the youngest musher to win the race at the age of 25. In 2017, at the age of 57, Dallas's father, Mitch Seavey, is the oldest and fastest person ever to win the race, crossing the line in Nome in 8 days, 3 hours, 40 minutes and 13 seconds. Dallas finished second, two hours and 44 minutes behind.

Teams generally race through blizzards causing whiteout conditions, sub-zero temperatures and gale-force winds which can cause the wind chill to reach -100 °F (-73 °C). The trail is through a harsh landscape of tundra and spruce forests, over hills and mountain passes, and across rivers. The Iditarod is regarded as a symbolic link to the early history of the state and is connected to many traditions commemorating the legacy of dog mushing.

This year, the Iditarod will be significantly different in many ways due to COVID-19 pandemic precautions. The race will follow the "Gold Trail Loop" and start in Deshka Landing, go 442 miles to Iditarod, Alaska, and loop back to the start for a total of 852 miles. The checkpoints which brought together so many villages in the past will now be away from these small population centers for safety.

In these strange times we must all adjust and go forward ... and that's what sled dogs do best!



Dowdy School Invitation

Many of the kids in the Kingsbury area that lived around the Darst Field oil fields went to the Dowdy School. The school was on Dowdy Road about a half mile off of FM 1150. The school is no longer there but a stone monument with a Texas Historical Commission plaque marks the place where the school once stood. The plaque reads:

"After the Wolters and Nixon School Districts merged in 1916, school trustees acquired 2 acres here from William Dowdy and erected the Wolters-Nixon School building. A gymnasium and classrooms were added in the early 1930s after an oil boom boosted the local economy. In 1932 the school was renamed Dowdy and offered high school classes for the first time. Despite a steady decline in student enrollment after 1938, the high school continued and students excelled in various team sports.

Dowdy School was annexed to the Seguin School System in 1951."

The student body included Alvin Hagemann who graduated from Dowdy High School in May of 1949. His
