
**BBQ Benefit Is July 26**

### The End For Billy The Kid

This week in the Old West, on July 14, 1881, Sheriff Pat Garrett shoots Henry McCarty, popularly known as Billy the Kid, to death at the Maxwell Ranch in New Mexico. Garrett, who had been tracking the Kid for three months after the gunslinger had escaped from prison only days before his scheduled execution, got a tip that Billy was

holed up with friends. While Billy was gone, Garrett waited in the dark in his bedroom. When Billy entered, Garrett shot him to death.

Back on April 1, 1878, Billy the Kid ambushed Sheriff William Brady and one deputy in Lincoln, New Mexico, after ranch owner John Tunstall had been **murdered**. Billy had worked at Tunstall's ranch and was outraged by his employer's slaying-vowing to hunt down every man responsible. Sheriff Brady and his men, who had been affiliated with rival ranchers, were involved with the gang that killed Tunstall on February 18. Billy's retaliatory attack left Brady and Deputy George Hindman dead. Although only 18 years old at the time, Billy had now committed as many as 17 murders.

Following his indictment for the murder of Sheriff Brady, Billy the Kid was the most wanted man in the West. Evading posses sent to capture him, he eventually struck a deal with the new governor of New Mexico: In return for his testimony against the perpetrators of the ongoing ranch wars in the state, Billy would be set free. Although he kept his word about the testimony, he began to distrust the promise that he would be released and so he escaped.

Once a fugitive, Billy killed a few more men, including the gunslinger Joe Grant, who had challenged him to a showdown. Legend has it that Billy managed to get a hold of Grant's gun prior to the fight and made sure that an empty chamber was up first in the man's revolver. When it came time to fire, only Billy's gun went off and Grant was left dead.

Legendary Sheriff Pat Garrett finally brought Billy the Kid in to stand trial. The judge sentenced Billy the Kid to hang until "you are dead, dead." Billy reportedly responded, "And you can go to hell, hell, hell." Two weeks before his scheduled execution, Billy escaped, killing two guards in the process.

Garrett mounted yet another posse to bring in the Kid. After tracing him to the Maxwell Ranch, Garrett shot him to death. No legal charges were brought against him since the killing was ruled a justifiable homicide.

### **Low Water Crossing Safety**

When you live in south Texas and, more times than not, hoping for rain, it's easy to forget how dangerous moving water can be.

With the unimaginable tragedies unfolding upriver from us, it would be good to remember some swift water information:

- A small car can be swept away by just 12 inches of moving water
- Larger vehicles like SUVs and trucks can be carried away by 2 feet of flowing water.
- Even shallow water can be dangerous, as 6 inches of fast-moving water can knock a person off their feet.

### **IMPORTANT CONSIDERATIONS**

• Moving water is more dangerous:

The force of flowing water is a significant factor in how easily a vehicle can be swept away.

Road conditions:

Roads can be washed out or damaged under floodwaters, making them unstable even if they appear passable.

• Turn Around, Don't Drown:

The National Weather Service recommends: "Turn Around, Don't Drown" when encountering flooded roadways.

Visibility:

Floodwater can obscure road conditions, making it easy to drive off a road into deeper water or a washout.

While we don't have river flooding in Kingsbury, we certainly have our share of creeks and low water crossings that can take a car off the road when the driver is not cautious enough.

# **Application For Place On Ballot**

There are two seats on the Kingsbury City Commission that are up for election in November - mayor and one


city commission member.

Anyone filing for a place on the ballot must:

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Be a Texas resident 12 months prior to the filing deadline
- Be a resident within the Kingsbury city limits for at least 6 months prior to the filing deadline
- Be registered to vote in Kingsbury by the filing deadline
- Be at least 18 years of age

The filing period runs from July 19th to August 18th at 5:00 pm.

Applications and a drop box will be available 24/7 on the outside message board at the Fire Station #1 (1060 FM 1104, Kingsbury).

# **Kingsbury Post Office and Drug Store**

A picture taken in front of the Kingsbury Post Office and Drug Store in 1912.

In the picture are Jeptha White, Jeptha's sister, Edna White Beaty, Edna's husband Van Beaty, and George Smith.

Jeptha Conrad White (1888-1962) was the pharmacist at the drug store (the "J.C.WHITE" painted on the front window). Edna, Van, and George were all mail carriers in 1912. The door to the left of the Post Office says "DENTIST" above the door. Can you imagine what **dentistry** was like in 1912?!

When this picture was taken in 1912 (and prior to the fire of 1929), the Post Office and Drug Store were in the middle of downtown east of Kingsbury Road about where the KVFD Station #2 currently is.

There are nine people in the photo. Can you spot them all?
