This Thursday is Halloween!

Halloween is an annual holiday, celebrated each year on October 31, that has roots in age-old European traditions. It originated with the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain, when people would light **bonfires** and wear costumes to ward off ghosts.

In the eighth century, Pope Gregory III designated November 1st as a time to honor all saints; soon, All Saints Day incorporated some of the traditions of Samhain. The evening before was known as All Hallows Eve, and later Halloween.

Over time, Halloween evolved into a day of activities like trick-or-treating and carving jack-o-lanterns. Around the world, as days grow shorter and nights get colder, people continue to usher in the season with gatherings, costumes and sweet treats.




Burn Ban In Effect

The Guadalupe County Commissions Court instituted an outdoor burn **ban** for Guadalupe County for 90 days starting October 2nd. The burn ban imposed by the Commissioners Court has specific guidelines for



Welding, cutting, and grinding or any activity that causes a spark



The official notification with all the guidelines can be found on the Guadalupe County website here.



The City of Kingsbury has a "trigger" ordinance where a burn ban is in effect in the city limits whenever there is a burn ban issued by the county.




As always, please take precautions and report any fire hazards immediately to the Kingsbury Volunteer Fire Department at 639-4499 or to the Guadalupe Fire Dispatch at 379-1224. To report a fire, please dial 911.



Of the 254 counties in Texas, there are currently 177 that have a burn ban, up from 165 last week. This leaves only 77 counties without a burn ban in the state.

Current burn bans by county in Texas last week and this week:




Kingsbury City Limits

Hello November

This Friday is the first day of November.

November is the eleventh and penultimate month of the year in the Julian and Gregorian Calendars and the fourth and last month to have the length of 30 days. November was the ninth month of the ancient Roman calendar. November retained its name (from the Latin *novem* meaning "nine") when January and February were added to the **Roman** calendar.

The zodiac signs for the month of November are Scorpio (October 23-November 21) and Sagittarius (November 22 – December 21).



The November birthstone, the topaz, symbolizes love and affection. It is believed to give the wearer increased strength and intellect.

November's birth flower is the chrysanthemum.

November Night Skies

While the bright moons made meteor watching in October difficult, November will bring better opportunities to catch some fireballs!

The meteor showers that peak in the month of November are:



Southern Taurids - With a slight peak on the night of November 4-5, the Southern Taurids are active through to November 20th. The moon will be 11% full on the night of the peak.

Northern Taurids - Peak is just before dawn on November 12th with about 3 meteors per hour. The conditions will be less than ideal with the moon at 79% full.

Leonids - The Leonids will be active from November 3rd to December 2nd with a peak on the night of November 17th-18th. The full moon falls on November 15th so it's best to find a "moon shadow" to see the meteors better. The Leonids are often fast and bright meteors with a high percentage of persistent trains.



First National Bank Of Kingsbury

The First National Bank of Kingsbury (bank charter number 10266) was built of red brick and opened in 1912. It printed \$60,850 dollars worth of national currency in 2 different denominations over the next 18 years until 1929.

I like how the name includes the "THE" at the beginning.

At one point, the bank manager broke the bank after it was found that he had put all of the money into a series of dry holes. He **claimed** a robbery, but was convicted and sent to prison. The bank was able to recover from that, but burned down in a fire several years later and was never rebuilt.

What could be in the big barrels on the horse-drawn cart? Beer? Water? Flour? Is it the bank manager's cart and they're full of money?
