Martin Luther King, Jr. Day

Monday, January 20th is Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.

Officially called Birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr. (and sometimes referred to as MLK Day), it is an American federal holiday marking the birthday of Martin Luther King Jr. It is observed on the third Monday of January each year, which is around King's birthday, January 15.


King was the chief spokesperson for **nonviolent** activism in the Civil Rights Movement, which successfully protested racial discrimination in federal and state law. The campaign for a federal holiday in King's honor began soon after his assassination in 1968. President Ronald Reagan signed the holiday into law in 1983, and it was first observed three years later. At first, some states resisted observing the holiday as such, giving it alternative names or combining it with other holidays. It was officially observed in all 50 states for the first time in 2000.
















Kingsbury T-Shirts - Now Available Online!


That says it all, doesn't it?!

Monday, February 3 - Last day to register to vote

Tuesday, February 18 - First day of early voting


Friday, February 21 - Last day to apply for ballot by mail (<u>received</u>, not postmarked)

Friday, February 28 - Last day of early voting

Tuesday, March 3 - Last day to receive ballot by mail, Election Day


Kingsbury News Past

All the news that's fit to print about what was happening in Kingsbury . . .

The Thursday, October 21, 1875 edition of the *Galveston Daily News* had the latest schedule for the "Sunset Route" where the "Trains are now Running to Kingsbury" and reducing the length of the stagecoach ride from there (the end of the railroad track at that time) to S.A. - probably to the Menger Hotel.

Between the train and the stagecoach you could get from Galveston to San Antonio in "Only 26 Hours"! I guess that was makin' good time in 1875!







In other news, the Courtwright brothers killed the sheriff in Chicago and then got strung up themselves for it by "forty masked men" and several people in Philadelphia have been counterfeiting postage stamps to Guinea and Bavaria (was that a lucrative thing in 1875?), Arthur Wolff, M.D. at the Grand Southern Hotel is a "surgeon and accoucheur" (had to look that one up - an accoucheur is a male midwife), and Cooper, Bailey & Co. has "herds of wild and strange beasts" and "freaks and whimsies thrown in". Cooper and Bailey would eventually merge with P.T. Barnum and become Barnum & Bailey's Circus.

Head on over to John Mulligan's if you need "oyster knives" (and who doesn't?!), Ricker & Wilder has "30 head fine large Kentucky mules", Broussard's has a "large stock" with "hard time prices" (but only if you're buying C.O.D.), and Peter Mueller can sharpen your razors and "surgical instruments".

And Kauffman & Runge has a LOT of coffee and salt, New Orleans has the "epizootic" (had to look that one up too - it means a non-human epidemic), and Garsia & Co. has "Texas, Western and Tropical Products" and will give you "prompt attention" to your orders for lemons and oranges.








Kingsbury Weather
