Meteors!

Halley's Comet won't swing by Earth again until 2061, but you could see pieces of it this week.

The Eta Aquarid meteor shower made of debris from Halley's Comet will peak this week. The meteors are bits of Halley's Comet that separated from the comet "many hundreds of years ago," according to the American Meteor Society.

Although the Perseid meteor shower in August may draw the most attention, the Eta Aquarid meteor shower, which occurs from roughly late April to mid-May, offers a long stretch of **spectacular** "shooting stars" that even a casual observer can spot in the night sky.

In 2021, the forecast calls for the greatest number of Eta Aquariid meteors to fall before dawn on May 5. But don't discount May 4 or 6, either or both of which might provide a good sprinkling of meteors, too.

You will have to watch out for the moon, however. In 2021, on the mornings of May 5 or 6, we don't expect the light of a waning crescent moon – rising near the time of dawn – to intrude too greatly. There will be a brighter waning moon lighting up more of the predawn hours on May 4. And there will be an even brighter waning moon on the mornings of May 3, 2, 1 and so on. On the morning of May 3, the moon will be at or near its half-illuminated last quarter phase, and the brighter moonlight may well wash some Eta Aquariid meteors from view. That said, the moon might also add a little something to your early-morning meteor drama, as the moon joins up with the bright morning planets, Jupiter and Saturn, on May 3, 4 and 5.

That being said - you might want to find a moon shadow!

Notice that the moon casts shadows. Find a moon shadow somewhere that still provides you with a wide expanse of sky for meteor-viewing. Find a group of trees bordering a wide open field or simply sit in the shadow of a barn or other building. Ensconced within a moon shadow, and far from the glow of city lights, the night all of a sudden darkens while the meteors brighten!

Rates this year can reach up to 40-50 meteors per hour during peak time, in theory. These fast meteors travel across the sky at about 42 miles (67 kilometers) per *second*! The shower is of medium brightness, and the darker your skies the more you'll see.

A picture captioned


"1917 Became Methodist Church 1879"
